	<b>Read</b> a book recommended by a friend, family member, library staff or a book list. On the line write either F (friend or family), L (library staff) or B (book list) to let us know who gave you the recommendation.
	<b>Read</b> a book with a child. On the line tell us the relationship you have with the child (child, grandchild, student, neighbor, niece, nephew, etc.)
	<b>Go</b> on a Story Walk route by yourself, or better yet, take a child with you. You will get some exercise while enjoying the children's picture book "My Lucky Day" by Keiko Kasza. June's Story Walk is located on the Wild Goose Trial and begins at the Wild Goose Park in Juneau. While on the Story Walk record all the pink pigtail letters you find along the way. After your walk, record on the line below the letters in the order you found them along the route.

	<b>Do</b> something kind for an animal. You can explore the outdoors with your pet, volunteer at an animal shelter, choose cruelty-free products, or teach children how to care for animals. There are so many ways you can express your kindness. Tell us what you did:

Once you find the hidden tail, visit the library to complete the weekly entry form with the location and name of the animal who owns the tail. ACTIVITY POINTS (Check the box when you complete each activity. Each activity is worth 30 points.)	
	<b>Enjoy</b> a screen-free day. It's harder than you think and requires some pre-planning. Make sure your closest friends & family know what day you're doing it so they don't freak out if you don't answer calls, text them back or answer email. You can do this!
	Read or listen to a book that is more than 10 years old.
	Follow Juneau Public Library on Facebook. If you do not have a Facebook account, check out our website to see our most recent Facebook posts.
	<b>Submit</b> a book review for a book you recently read. You can email your review to juneau.monarchlibraries@gmail.com., or you may bring in a handwritten review to the library. On the blank line tell us how many "STARS" you would give the book you reviewed. I give this book stars.
	5 stars = Wonderful! I will likely reread this book, 4 stars = Very Good! I will probably reread some parts, 3 stars = Okay, easy to finish. I have no desire to reread any part of this book, 2 stars = I pushed myself to finish this book, 1 star = I failed to finish the book.
	<b>Go</b> on a Story Walk route by yourself, or better yet, take a child with you. You will get some exercise while enjoying the children's picture book "I Want an Ostrich" by Sonya Annita Song. July's Story Walk is located in the City Park in Juneau. While on the Story Walk record all the brown feather letters you find along the way. After your walk, record on the line the letters in the order you found them along the route.
	Visit a place where you can see tame (farm, pet store) or wild (marsh, zoo) animals (and all their adorable tails). On the line write where you went.
	It's time to tell a tale. <b>Call</b> up a friend or family member to discuss books. Ask him to share with you what he is currently reading, what he's recently read, or a book he can't wait to read and why. Thenyou share the same with him!
	<b>Research</b> the life spans of animals. Who typically lives longer; larger or smaller animals? On the line put in order from shortest to longest life span these 5 animals. (cow, lion, parrot, opossum, elephant)
	<b>Read</b> a debut author's book. Summer is the perfect time to find your next "favorite" author. Library staff are eager to help you find a 2021 debut author and are prepared with a printed list of 197 different debut authors. We're here to help you find the perfect book. On the line write the name of the debut author who wrote the book you read.
	<b>Try</b> something NEW! Download our NEW Monarch2Go app OR print from your mobile device. Printing charges apply to all copies (black & white copies are \$0.20 per page).
