	Submit a book review for a book you recently read. You can email your review to juneau@monarchlibraries.org or you may bring in a handwritten review to the library. On the line write the date you submitted the review.
	Play any game outdoors. Are there any games you usually play indoors that you could play outdoors? (board games, card games, learning games, etc.) On the line below, write the name of the game or games you played.

	Enjoy a screen-free day. Have your family participate with you.
	Find an unusual place to read. Here are some ideas: in a tree house or barn, in your parent's bed, on a blanket at the beach, at a campsite by a fire, on a swing-gently swinging, in the bleachers at a ball game. Of course, you can come up with other places to read, too. On the line write the unusual place your read your book.
	Try a new fruit or vegetable you have never had. Write what you tried on the line. Did you like it?
	Go on the Story Walk with a trusted adult. You will get some exercise while enjoying the children's picture book "Not Your Typical Dragon" by Dan Bar-el. When you are done with the Story Walk record the letters you found along the way and write them on the line in the order that you found them along the route.
	Stay up to date on the news kids want to hear. Visit the "KidsNews" website. It is an Australian based news source, but much of the news is interesting for kids all over the globe! On the menu bar click on "News" and read a few articles. If you don't have Internet at home, you can use a computer at the library. On the line write an interesting fact that you learned from the article or articles you read.
	Ask an adult to tell you a story from their childhood. Ask them why it is one of their favorite stories.
	There are real castles all over the world and even in the United States. Why not take a virtual tour of a castle right from your couch? You can search for castle tours online. If you don't have Internet at home, you can use a computer at the library. On the line write the name of the castle you visited. If you toured more than one castle, write the name of your favorite.
	Read several poems from a poetry book OR write a Haiku. To write a Haiku, first "Imagine Your Story". Most Haiku are inspired by a memorable experience, nature or beauty. Share your Haiku with a friend, family member or librarian. On the line write what the topic of your poem or written Haiku was. Was the person you shared your Haiku with able to guess what your Haiku was about? If you read some poems in a poetry book, write the title of your favorite poem below.
	Read a book based on a legend, myth or fable. Need some ideas? Call the Juneau Public Library and our librarians would be happy to assist you with some recommendations.
	Read a book about anyone you consider a hero, real or imagined. Write the name of your hero on the line below. If you need help finding a good hero book idea, try searching the internet. If you don't have internet at home, you can search the Internet using one of our library computers or ask one of your librarians for a good recommendation.
